





Headstones Provided for Deceased Union Civil War Veterans, 1861-1904



- Congress passed a series of acts providing headstones and burials for honorably discharged Civil War veterans in both national and private cemeteries
- Contains headstone information provided by the government for deceased veterans of the War of 1812 & the Civil War
- Most soldiers included in this database died between 1861 and 1903, and gravestones were erected between 1879 and 1903



Confederate Records 1861 and Beyond

Looking at the State Level

- Confederate soldiers and sailors enlisted or were recruited at a local and state level
- Most individuals received discharges, pensions, payment receipts, and other paperwork at a local or state level.
- All pension applications for assistance were reviewed by a board to ensure the veteran had no other means of support
- Depending on the state, widows and children were eligible for support on a case by case basis
- Special censuses for veterans were collected periodically
